Thoughts on Tradition Four

<u>Short form</u> - "Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole."

Long form - "With respect to its own affairs, each A.A. group should be responsible to no other authority than its own conscience. But when its plans concern the welfare of neighboring groups also, those groups ought to be consulted. And no group, regional committee, or individual should ever take any action that might greatly affect A.A. as a whole without conferring with the Trustees of the General Service Board. On such issues our common welfare is paramount."

"Just as AA gives each member great freedom --- both as a means toward recovery and as a blessing of recovery --- AA gives the groups great freedom through our Tradition of group autonomy.

On the individual level, you're a member when you say you are. The same principle applies to the AA groups --- you're a group when you say you are."

Joel C., Pacific region trustee, January 31, 2015 Bill was passionate in his defense of this principle; here's a quote from a July, 1946 Grapevine article, "The Individual in Relation to AA as a Group":

"So long as there is the slightest interest in sobriety, the most unmoral, the most antisocial, the most critical alcoholic may gather about him a few kindred spirits and announce to us that a new Alcoholics Anonymous group has been formed. Anti-God, anti-medicine, anti our recovery program, even anti-each other - these rampant individuals are still an AA group, if they think so!"

"The AA Traditions are neither rules, regulations, nor laws. We obey them willingly because we ought to and because we want to. Perhaps the secret of their power lies in the fact that these life-giving communications spring out of living experience and are rooted in love."

"I prefer to think of myself as a custodian of the Traditions, rather than a guardian of the Traditions. Guardians use swords and spears; custodians use mops and brooms."
