She asked, "Are you willing to go to any length to get it?" I wasn't too sure about that! She helped me by suggesting that I could be willing, to be willing, to go to any length. I imagined the necessity to live in a tent in Zimbabwe. The actual requirement was not nearly so exotic.

For me, the question is, "When my heart has broken, when my mind has shattered, and when my body has betrayed me, am I willing to ask for help?" "Am I willing to reach out to an alcoholic, rather than to alcohol?" The moment that I answer "Yes," I am ready to begin a program of recovery and action.
